

## Transition to the new NAS Education Programme


This summary chart gives an overview of how the *NAS Training Programme* easily translates into the *NAS Education Programme*.

There is no requirement to work towards a Certificate or Award, but members automatically accrue credits for being involved.


In this new system you must be a member to accrue credits for your involvement. For more specific information on each course see the charts on the following pages.

## If you have a *NAS Part 1 Certificate*...

If you have been awarded a *NAS Part 1 Certificate* you will receive credits for completing *ELearning Intertidal & Terrestrial Archaeology* or *ELearning Underwater Archaeology + Surveyor Day*



You will also receive 10 credits toward your *NAS Certificate in Maritime Archaeology*




Plus the already acquired 5 credits from the *former Introduction course*



You will then only need to acquire 85 more credits from attending *Maritime Archaeology Courses*, undertaking *Fieldwork* and attending *Maritime Events* to achieve your *NAS Certificate in Maritime Archaeology*

### If you have a *NAS Part 2 Certificate*...



### If you are currently working towards a *NAS Part 2 Certificate*...

- You will receive 5 credits for each conference attended (10 credits for two conferences)
- You will receive 10 credits for your Part II report, which will also count towards the report requirement for the *NAS Award in Maritime Archaeology*

### If you have a *NAS Part 3 Certificate*...

If you have been awarded the *NAS Part 3 Certificate*  
you are automatically awarded the  
*NAS Certificate in Maritime Archaeology*

If you are interested in continuing your education with us,  
follow the guidelines below to achieve your  
*NAS Award in Maritime Archaeology*

#### ***NAS Award in Maritime Archaeology***

- This award is achieved from accumulating 300 credits
- Same requirements as the Certificate plus...
- ...200 credits (c. 12 weeks) extra credits from completion of *Maritime Archaeology Courses, Fieldwork* or attending *Maritime Events*
- ...a 2,000 word archaeological report

### If you are currently working towards a *NAS Part 3 Certificate*...

- You will receive 5 credits for each course attendance day (eg 10 credits for 2-day courses)

## If you have or are working towards a *NAS Part 4 Diploma*...

If you are currently working on completing your *NAS Part 4 Diploma* you can take until 1 January 2018 to complete this

If you have an existing *NAS Part 4 Diploma*, or you successfully complete your *NAS Part 4 Diploma* by 1 January 2018, you will automatically be awarded the *NAS Award in Maritime Archaeology*

### ***NAS Award in Maritime Archaeology***

- This award is achieved from accumulating 300 credits
- Same requirements as the Certificate plus...
- ...200 credits (c. 12 weeks) extra credits from completion of *Maritime Archaeology Courses*, *Fieldwork* or attending *Maritime Events*
- ...a 2,000 word archaeological report
